Be ready to work and complete several lessons pertaining to this book when returning to school.

The second book will be a book of your choice from the <u>Henry Huggins Series</u> by author Beverly Cleary. You may choose any one of the books from this series that will appeal to your interests. After reading your book, you will then complete the attached report for this book, "Book Report Fun!" Please use erasable pen, cursive writing, and complete sentences on your report.

Remember that both of these books are your responsibility to read by September. All projects, tests, and extra activities involving these books will be averaged into your Language Arts grade for the First Marking Period.

The book you are going to be reading, <u>The Cricket in Times Square</u>, by George Selden, is a very fun-loving and adventurous story. The author takes the first few chapters to introduce the main characters; Tucker, Mario, Chester, and Harry Cat. The first part of your project is to fill out a "Character Characteristics" model for each of your characters. You are allowed to print on this model. This must be completed neatly!

After you have read about the characters, you will start reading about Chester's adventure throughout the story. The author uses wonderful visualization words to help the reader imagine the characters in different settings of the story. Chester's adventure starts in one type of setting and ends in another. The second part of your project is to illustrate on the paper "Scene It" where Chester was originally from and where he is throughout the rest of the story. Use the author's words to help you create two colorful scenes!

Lastly, on the paper "In Their Shoes", you will be writing a paragraph in response to a question. Please make sure you write in erasable pen and in your best cursive writing!


All parts of your project are due on Friday September 5, 2014. Any late work will result in a 5 point deduction per day.


I truly hope you enjoy this wonderful story! Remember to try to read as many words on your own as you can.






