The Holidays are near...and, as a special service, our school is hosting a Lil' Shopper's Shoppe[®]. Children will have the opportunity to pick out their own inexpensive, high quality gifts for family and friends.

The Lil' Shopper's Shoppe[®] is a program designed for children to shop on their own at school, in a safe, non-commercial environment. They can learn to budget their money and spend wisely, while also experiencing the "Joy Of Giving."

The Lil' Shopper's Shoppe[®] will be set up in the school and will be run by parent and grandparent volunteers. Gifts are priced for a child's budget, ranging from \$0.25 to \$10.00, with most priced under \$5.00. There are gifts available for ALL the members of your Lil' Shopper's family.

Reduce, Recycle, and Reuse

Dear Parents,

"Let us be protectors of God's creation, protectors of God's plan inscribed in nature, protectors of one another and of the environment. I would therefore like us all to make the serious commitment to respect and care for creation, to pay attention to every person, to combat the culture of waste and of throwing out so as to foster a culture of solidarity and encounter."

These words of Pope Francis call us to be stewards of our earth and its inhabitants. In order to help bring about a 'culture of solidarity', starting December 1st, we will begin collecting various items for recycling or reuse.

<u>Cell phones</u> can be reprogrammed and resold so our service men and women will be able to keep in touch with their families here at home. Cell phones will be donated to Cell Phones for Soldiers, a company endorsed by both AT&T and Verizon Wireless, that donates a portion of the profit from the sale of the phones to buy cellular air time for the soldiers. Since 2004 they have provided 210 million minutes of free time to our service members and have recycled over 11.3 million cell phones reducing the impact on landfills. They send approximately 3200 phone cards to our service members each week.

Used <u>computer ink cartridges</u> can be recycled through our paper suppliers thereby earning rebates which will help us control costs and teach our students to be good stewards of the earth. Beginning Monday December 1st, bins will be set up in the cafeteria for the ink cartridges and cell phones. Mr. Murray will handle processing these items. Should you have any questions please contact him directly through the school web site.

Over the next several months we will inform you of additional items for the recycling program and of further measures we will institute in school in order to "reduce, recycle and reuse."
