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## Volunteer Positions Available

~Hospitality - Helping with serving breakfast or desserts for special occasions. For example: the Benefactor's breakfast, serving cakes for graduation
~Advertising Committee - Helping with advertising events taking place at the school. Example: Putting ads in the local newspapers or the Church bulletin.
~Fundraising Committee - Working towards running \& creating various fundraisers to help raise money for the school. Example: Yankee candle, Gertrude Hawk candy, percentage of store/restaurant sales on specific days.
