Dear Parents in Grades Five through Eight:

It is obvious that cell phone's are a part of each of our lives including many of our students. While we ask that they remain off in their backpacks that is not often what happens. Teachers hear phones ringing, students carry them into the bathrooms for selfies and we find them being used in class.

While we are aware of a students need to get in touch with parents after school hours, there is truly no reason for them to be on and active during the day. This is especially true during lockdowns when silence needs to be maintained in classrooms. Beginning Monday, March 20, 2017, teachers in grades five through eight will have a holder for all cell phones. Students will need to shut of their cell phone and place it in the holder where it will be held until dismissal. All classrooms are locked when a teacher is not in them so there should be no concern about cell phones going missing.

If you are not comfortable with this arrangement, please do not allow your child to bring a cell phone to school. If a student does not surrender their cell phone and we find they are still carrying one, the student will be subject to a detention or suspension as determined by the administration.
