

Virtual Learning Reminders

Virtual learning is an extension of the in-person classroom. In order to make this a productive experience for the students and teachers, please be mindful of the following:

- ✓ Virtual learners should be online by 7:40 AM, the official start of our school day.
- ✓ Students should be in their school golf shirt or gym t-shirt
- ✓ They should participate in the morning activities in their homeroom
- Students should raise their hand to participate just as if they are present in the school building, they should not be calling out. They should also not be eating unless it is snack time.
- Class participation is key to successful learning. All questions should be asked during the class period. If help is needed with a lesson the student needs to ask the teacher while the lesson is taking place, just like they would if they were in-person,
- The virtual learner's camera should always be on and facing them while they are seated at a desk or table. He/she should be engaged in the lesson, not looking at other devices or talking with others outside the virtual classroom.
- The ability to print is key for virtual learners, so please ensure that you have a working printer. This is also specified in the Parent/Student Handbook.
- ✓ If you are having technology issues, call the school office immediately so we can notify the teacher.

Please be sure to review the items listed above with your child. We all want virtual learning to be an effective extension of the in-person classroom. Thank you in advance for your help and cooperation!

Dear St. Stanislaus Kostka Families,

Tomorrow you will receive a copy of your child's MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) test scores. The test was administered online over the weeks of October 12th and October 19th. Students were encouraged to do the best they could and when unsure to choose the answer they thought best answered the question. This is an adaptive test that changes the level of difficulty of the questions in response to how the student answers.

If you are not familiar with what you are seeing, MAP does a good job of explaining what you are looking at. Additionally, on the reverse side of the results, you will see ways that you can help your child exhibit growth throughout the year. The graph will show you their winter 2020 score and now the fall 2020 score (except 1st grade since this is their first test), under normal circumstances we would be looking for a reasonable amount of growth between 10-20 points on the RIT scale. We are not under normal circumstances at the moment; so we will be reviewing these test scores to see where students are struggling, look to see if there are holes in their foundation due to last year's unusual last marking period, and determine how to proceed with instruction to be sure each student has a solid foundation and is able to exhibit growth moving forward.

What should always be kept in mind is that a test like MAP is a snapshot of a day and a time and only one piece of the entire educational puzzle that each of our students is. If you have any questions or concerns, I encourage you to reach out to the teacher of the subject you have questions about. I strongly suggest that we wait and we look forward to our winter testing to see valid growth data.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

I hope and pray we all continue to remain safe and well by God's grace.

Just a reminder that, if you have not sent in the health forms that was in your child's registration packet, please do so as soon as possible. Both new and returning students are expected to complete a health history update each year; informing the school of any health changes such as new allergies, medications, surgeries, etc; since the last school year. You may print the health forms from the school's website under 'nurse', or let me know if you need a copy sent home with your child. Recent annual physical and immunization updates must be included if the student is on medication or received new vaccines. The nursing services permission form has to be signed and returned every year too. Thank you to the families that have already sent in theirs.

It is also required, for the safety of your child to inform the school of any and all medications that he/she takes at home on a regular basis. In order to have the correct information in case of emergency, please send to school a copy of the prescription indicating the name and the dosage of the medication or bring a doctor's note providing this information. All health records are regarded as confidential and treated as such by school personnel.

On another note: amid the current pandemic, the regular influenza season is upon us as you all know. Hopefully the current protective measures for Covid-19 will help give us a better protection from the flu as well. The flu shot is recommended for all students for additional protection during this time. **Children under 5 years of age are required by the State to receive the annual influenza vaccine between Sept.** 1st **and Dec.** 31st **in order to remain in school. Please send all records to school when they receive them.**

Dear Sir/Madam:

I would like to introduce our new program to you and your school community. Under the direction of FEMA, the NJ Hope and Healing Program has formed due to the impact of COVID-19 which provides Crisis Counselors, known as the Crisis Counselor Program (CCP).

The NJ Hope and Healing program helps people recover and rebuild their lives after a disaster. The CCP supports short-term interventions that involve the following counseling goals:

- Helping disaster survivors understand their current situation and reactions
- Reducing stress and providing emotional support
- Assisting survivors in reviewing their disaster recovery options
- Promoting the use or development of coping strategies
- Connecting survivors with other people and agencies who can help them in their recovery process

The CCP follows key principles that make it different from other survivor support programs. The CCP is:

- Strengths-based: CCP services promote resilience, empowerment, and recovery.
- Anonymous: Crisis counselors do not classify, label, or diagnose people. No records or case files are kept.

• Outreach-oriented: Crisis counselors typically deliver services in the community where survivors live and work. In response to a pandemic, services may be delivered virtually as appropriate.

• Designed to strengthen existing community support systems: The CCP supplements, but does not end or replace, existing community systems.

Counselors help enhance social and emotional connections to others in the community and promote effective coping strategies and resilience. Crisis counselors work closely with community organizations to familiarize themselves with available resources so they can refer survivors to behavioral health treatment and other services.

We have several resources available for many different needs. Feel free to reach out to myself or any of the Crisis Counselors for more information. I can be reached at Catholic Charities, DOM, 26 Safran Ave, Edison, NJ 08837, 732-646-4076. We are available Monday – Friday, 9 am to 5 pm.


