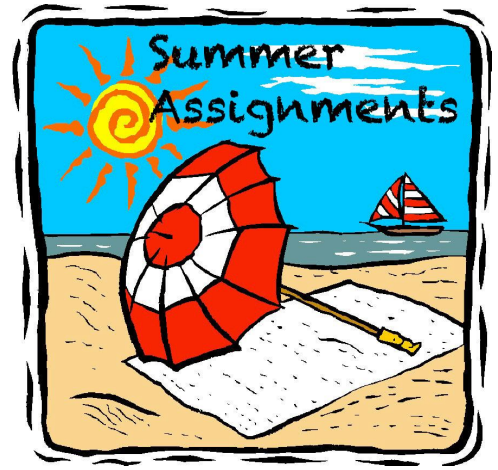

- Students should spread out the skills over the summer months rather than completing all of them a week or two before school begins. It is recommended that students complete 4 skills in June, 8 skills in July and 8 skills in August. I will be monitoring their progress over the summer.
- Some skills you completed during the school year will be repeated. Even if you have already completed a skill during the school year, you must do that skill again during the summer.
